
Liturgy of the Hours in the Rule

- "Let them join in liturgical prayer in one of the forms..." (Rule: Article 8)
- "...participate...giving priority to the celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours." (Constitution: Article 14.4)

- Joy in the Canticles
- Joy in the Antiphons
- Joy in the Reading
- Joy in the Closing Prayer

Praying with Scripture

- Why pray Scripture (the Liturgy of the Hours and daily Readings)
 - Formed by the Word of God
 - Prayer of the Church
 - Enter into a natural rhythm prayer
 - Come to know God intimately

Daily Readings



- Readings of the Church
- Gospel paired with an OT or NT reading, coupled with a Psalm
- Forms us a disciple of Jesus and leads us into prayer and contemplation
 - Lectio Divina

God Present in His Word

Dei Verbum

- Through the Words of the St. Francis we form an image of:
 - His spirit
 - His mind
 - How he pictured Jesus
 - How he viewed the Gospel
